

SUMMARY: Staff will present a report detailing the cost associated and feasibility to host a City Co-Ed Adult Softball League.

DISCUSSION: At the September 9, 2025, Community Services Commission meeting, the Commission requested staff to prepare a report detailing the cost and feasibility associated with hosting a City Co-Ed Adult Softball League. The Community Services Department is currently focusing on major new assignments, such as planning for a series of events and programs related to the upcoming World Cup and 2028 Los Angeles Olympics.

Furthermore, the City's park reservation calendar demonstrates a vast majority of dates are unavailable due to existing City leagues and community partners such as the South El Monte Little National Little League, El Monte/ South El Monte Jets, and the American Youth Soccer Organization.

Proposed Co-Ed Adult Softball League Analysis

Program

The proposed Co-Ed Adult Softball League (“softball league”) is a ten-player team program with rules and polices established by the USA Softball Football (for slow pitch) organization. The program details are as follows:

Teams

To operate a successful softball league, it is recommended that the league consist of six (6) teams with all players be a minimum of eighteen (18) years of age with at least 33% of the roster being female.

Dates and Season

The proposed season dates have been determined based on the current City of South El Monte’s (“City”) youth sports leagues and community partners, such as the National Little League, Jets Football, and the American Youth Soccer League. After reviewing the City’s park reservation calendar a vast majority of the dates are unavailable. The available days of the week are Saturdays and Sundays.

Registration

Registration would mirror current processes using that can completed online and in person at the Community Center. The fee of \$100.00 for residents and \$150.00 for non-residents is based on the City’s current fee schedule and research from local flag football programs.

Cost

The cost to operate and manage a flag football league is in the estimated amount of \$39,900.00. This cost includes staff time, equipment, contract services, and fees. Please find below a chart detailing the cost associated with hosting a Flag football League.

SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF THE CITY'S 2026 SPECIAL EVENTS CALENDAR

SUMMARY: The City's 2026 Special Events Calendar includes recommended dates, times, and locations for the City-sponsored events held by the Community Services Department. All scheduled events are subject to modifications, date changes, and/or cancelations.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Staff recommends Community Services Commission consider and propose the City's 2026 Special Events Calendar to City Council.

FISCAL/FINANCIAL IMPACT: Funding for the events scheduled from January 1, 2026, to June 30, 2026, is included in the City's approved Fiscal Year ("FY") 2025/2026 Special Events, Night Market, and Senior Services budget in the projected amount of \$120,000.00. The events scheduled between July 1, 2026, and December 31, 2026, will be discussed during budget sessions for FY 2026/2027.

DISCUSSION: In 2025, the City hosted approximately 38 City special events and 17 senior services luncheons. The Community Services Department strives to provide safe and successful events that invite community engagement in City facilities, streets, and parks. The department partners with community members and agencies to promote information, sponsorship opportunities, and resources. The City 2026 Special Events Calendar includes the City-sponsored events and senior services luncheons. Staff proposes the following changes to selected events that differ from the traditional dates and locations:

2026 Night Market Series

The Night Market series are held on Santa Anita Avenue from 6:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. The Night Markets feature a live band performance, over 40 vendors, a beer garden sponsored by a local youth sports organizations, and activities for all members of the community.

In 2025, the City Council approved hosting ten Night Markets throughout the year, two in

the spring, six (6) in the summer, and two (2) in the fall. However, due to competing community programs and activities such as back-to-school night and youth sports, there was a noticeable decrease in attendance in the last two (2) Night Markets held in the fall. Staff recommends removing the two (2) fall night markets and directing the resources to other events.

The proposed 2026 Night Market series is as follows:

Spring Night Market Events

- April 16, 2026
- May 7, 2026

Summer Night Market Events

- June 12, 2026
- June 25, 2026
- July 16, 2026
- July 30, 2026
- August 13, 2026
- August 20, 2026

Night Markets held in June and July will feature live viewing of the FIFA World Cup during broadcasting hours.

Fourth of July Celebration

In 2025, the City Council approved hosting two (2) events, the Firework Festival held on July 3, 2025, featuring the live firework show and the 4th of July Celebration on July 4, 2025, with its normally planned festivities.

For 2026, staff were able to secure a live firework show on July 4, 2026. With the show confirmed, the City can host a one-day event on Saturday, July 4, 2026, with the normal festivities and the night concluding with a live firework show. Please find the details below of the proposed event:

2026 Proposed 4th of July Celebration

Date: Saturday, July 4, 2026

Locations: South El Monte High School (“SEMHS”)

Times: 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.

Activities:

- SEMHS: Band Performance, Kids Fun Zone, Live Firework Show, and Food Vendors
- 4th of July Boxing Show will be held at the South El Monte Community Center from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

State of the City

The State of the City address is an annual presentation reporting on past year's accomplishments, outlining future plans and challenges, and fosters community engagement and transparency by sharing progress on economic development, public safety, infrastructure, and other key initiatives. The event invites the local business community to sponsor a table at the selected venue. All proceeds are allocated into the City scholarships account and distributed to students attending schools in the City.

In the effort to create a foremost event, City staff is requesting input from the City Council on the 2026 State of the City program, logistics, and scholarship distribution.

National Day of Prayer

The National Day of Pray event is held on the first Thursday of May. The observation calls on members of the community to pray for the United States, the State of California, and the City of South El Monte. Community leaders guide event attendees through prayers for first responders, armed forces, local businesses, churches, education and overall health.

In the effort to create a foremost event, City staff is requesting input from the City Council of the 2026 National Day of Prayer program and logistics.

SEM Sheriff Team Meet and Greet

The SEM Sheriff Team Meet and Greets provides an opportunity for members of the community to meet the South El Monte Sheriffs team, ask questions, and provide feedback on public safety issues. The events are set up throughout the City of South El Monte, visiting different neighborhoods while a complimentary meal for all in attendance. The proposed details for the events are as followed:
