SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION NO. 22-18, PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY PERSISTS AND AUTHORIZING THE USE OF REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETING PROCEDURES BY THE CITY'S LEGISLATIVE BODIES AS AUTHORIZED BY GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54953(E) ET SEQ. FOR THE PERIOD OF MARCH 8, 2022 THROUGH APRIL 6, 2022

SUMMARY: On September 16, 2021, Governor Newsom signed AB 361 into law. AB 361 was made effective October 1, 2021. Pursuant to AB 361, staff recommends consideration of Resolution No. 22-18 proclaiming a local emergency persists and authorizing the use of remote meeting procedures by the City's legislative bodies, which can include meetings held via a virtual platform (e.g. Zoom), for the period of March 8, 2022 through April 6, 2022.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Staff recommends City Council adopt Resolution No. 22-18, proclaiming a local emergency persists and authorizing the use of alternative meeting procedures by the City's legislative bodies, such as utilizing a virtual platform (e.g. Zoom) for the period of March 8, 2022 through April 6, 2022.

FISCAL IMPACT: None.

DISCUSSION: In March of 2020, at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Newsom proclaimed a State of Emergency in California, and issued Executive Order N-25-20 to facilitate the ability of legislative bodies to meet using remote/virtual platforms to comply with health orders. Since that time, several other Executive Orders have been issued that further modified the requirements related to the conduct of teleconferenced meetings and the right of public participation during the state of emergency. The Executive Orders collectively operated to remove certain requirements for teleconferenced meetings, including that each teleconference location be accessible to the public, and that members of the public be able to address the legislative body at each teleconference location.

The Executive Orders allowed the City Council and each of the City's legislative bodies, commissions, and committees subject to the Brown Act to modify how meetings were conducted to protect the health and safety of the legislative bodies, staff, and the public, while ensuring transparency and accessibility for open and public meetings. However, those executive orders expired on October 1, 2021.

On September 16, 2021, Governor Newsom signed AB 361 into law. AB 361 was made effective October 1, 2021, to correspond to the timing of expiration of the executive orders.

AB 361 allows legislative bodies to continue to utilize remote/virtual platforms for meetings during a state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor that includes the City, provided that one of the following three criteria is met with respect to the meeting:

- i) State or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; or
- ii) The legislative body is meeting for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the state of emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; or
- iii) The legislative body has previously determined, by majority vote, that, as a result of the state of emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.

These provisions of AB 361 are effective until January 1, 2024. This means these provisions may be invoked any time there is a proclaimed state of emergency by the Governor (e.g., wildfires) and the City Council can make at least one of the enumerated findings.

On October 26, 2021, City Council adopted Resolution No. 21-69 proclaiming a local emergency persists and authorizing the use of remote teleconference procedures by the City's legislative bodies for the period of October 26 through November 25, 2021. To avoid a lapse in time between meetings and the effective date of Resolution No. 21-69, on November 9, 2021, City Council adopted Resolution No. 21-72 proclaiming a local emergency persists and authorizing the use of remote teleconference procedures by the City's legislative bodies for the period of November 9 through December 9, 2021. Since then, City Council has adopted the following resolutions authorizing the same: Resolution No. 21-78 adopted on December 14, 2021 for the period of December 14, 2021 through January 12, 2022; Resolution No. 22-02 adopted on January 11, 2022 for the period of January 11, 2022 through February 9, 2022; and Resolution No. 22-11 adopted February 8, 2022 for the period of February 8, 2022 through March 9, 2022.

In large part due to the Omicron variant, there has been a sharp surge of Covid-19 positive cases since December 2021, leading to a positivity rate of 14.90% as of December 27, 2021 and 1,792 hospitalizations as of January 1, 2022. The data available as of March 2, 2022 indicates a total of 2,797,6428 cases reported and 30,773 deaths reported in the Los Angeles County, Long Beach, and Pasadena Health Departments as a result of COVID-19.

In light of the continuing COVID-19 emergency, and the continued threats to health and safety posed by indoor meetings with large attendance, staff recommends adoption of the proposed resolution making the findings required to invoke AB 361. Doing so will

allow the meetings of the City Council and each of the City's legislative bodies to continue to occur by teleconference, without adhering to the teleconferencing requirements set out in Government Code Section 54953(b)(3) that would otherwise apply absent invocation of AB 361.

Continued reliance on AB 361 will require adoption of a new resolution making the required findings every 30 days.

A RESOLUTION OF THE SOUTH EL MONTE CITY COUNCIL
PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY PERSISTS AND
AUTHORIZING THE USE OF REMOTE TELECONFERENCE
MEETING PROCEDURES BY THE CITY'S LEGISLATIVE
BODIES, AS AUTHORIZED BY GOVERNMENT CODE
SECTION 54953(E) *ET SEQ.*, FOR THE PERIOD OF MARCH 8,
2022 THROUGH APRIL 6, 2022

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of South El Monte is committed to preserving and nurturing public access, transparency, observation and participation in its meetings and the meetings of each of its legislative bodies (as that term is defined in Government Code §54952, including commissions, boards and committees subject to the Brown Act); and

WHEREAS, all meetings of the City's legislative bodies are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act, codified as Government Code sections 54950 *et seq.*, so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and observe the City's legislative bodies conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, as amended by Assembly Bill 361 (2021), amending Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq.*, allows for remote teleconferencing observation and participation in meetings by members of a legislative body and members of the public, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3) regarding, subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, the initial required condition is a declaration of a state of emergency by the Governor pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act, Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state and within the boundaries of the City, as provided in Government Code section 8558; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, pursuant to Government Code section 8625, Governor Newsom declared the existence of a state of emergency for the State of California, in response to the outbreak of respiratory illness due to a novel coronavirus (a disease now known as COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, also on March 4, 2020, the County of Los Angeles followed suit and declared the existence of a state of emergency for the County of Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, out of an abundance of caution to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the community, the Mayor of the City of South El Monte proclaimed a local emergency due to the public health threat caused by COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor's proclamation found that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within the City as a result of the COVID-19 virus and that these conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the City; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, the City's Director of Emergency Services declared a local emergency for the City pursuant to Chapter 2.32 of the South El Monte Municipal Code, finding that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within the City as a result of the COVID-19 virus and that these conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the City; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 20-24, ratifying the proclamation of a local emergency in response to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54953(e) further requires that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; or, the legislative body of the City finds that meeting in person would present imminent risk to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, the State of California and County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, County officials are requiring masking in an effort to slow the continuously high level of transmission of COVID-19 throughout Los Angeles County, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") continue to recommend physical distancing; and

WHEREAS, in large part due to the Omicron variant, there has been a sharp surge of Covid-19 positive cases since December 2021, leading to a positivity rate of 14.90% as of December 27, 2021 and 1,792 hospitalizations as of January 1, 2022. The data available as of March 2, 2022 indicates a total of 2,797,6428 cases reported and 30,773 deaths reported in the Los Angeles County, Long Beach, and Pasadena Health Departments; and

WHEREAS, the Council hereby finds that such emergency conditions persist in the City, such that meeting in person for the meetings of the legislative bodies of the City would present imminent risk to the health and safety of attendees as a result of the increased risk of the spread of the COVID-19 virus among those in attendance; and

WHEREAS, the Council hereby finds that the state of emergency due to the COVID-19 virus and the conditions related thereto has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons within the City that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the City, and thereby affirms, authorizes, and proclaims that the existence of a local emergency persists throughout the City, and ratifies the proclamation of state of emergency by the Governor of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, the Council hereby finds that, as a consequence of the existing local emergency, the legislative bodies of the City shall conduct their meetings without compliance with Government Code section 54953(b)(3), and shall instead comply with the remote teleconference meeting requirements as authorized by Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the Council affirms that the City will allow for observation and participation by Councilmembers, members of the City's legislative bodies, and the public by allowing public participation and comment in real time via Zoom or by telephone, as well as allowing limited in-person attendance for certain legislative bodies of the City, as will be duly indicated in the agendas of the legislative bodies, respectively, in an effort to protect the constitutional and statutory rights of all attendees.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH EL MONTE FINDS, RESOLVES, AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated herein Resolution by reference.

Section 2. The Council hereby recognizes and affirms the existence and conditions of a state of emergency as proclaimed by the Governor, the existence of emergency conditions in the City, and affirms, authorizes, and proclaims that the existence of a local emergency persists throughout the City.

Section 3. The Council hereby ratifies the Governor of the State of California's Proclamation of State of Emergency, effective as of its issuance date of March 4, 2020.

Section 4. Further, the Council finds that holding the meetings of the City's legislative bodies in person with no limitations to attendance would present imminent risk to the health and safety of attendees as a result of the increased risk of the spread of the COVID-19 virus among those in attendance, and that the State of California and County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing in connection with the COVID-19 emergency, as required by Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq.*

Section 5. The City Manager and legislative bodies of the City are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, conducting open and public meetings via teleconference in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq.* and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

Section 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall be effective until the earlier of (i) April 6, 2022, or (ii) such time the Council adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies (as that term is defined in Government Code §54952, including commissions, boards and committees subject to the Brown Act) of the City may continue to teleconference without compliance with Government Code section 54953(b)(3).

SUBJECT: DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF THE 2022 SUMMER CONCERT SERIES AND FOURTH OF JULY CELEBRATION BAND PERFORMANCES

SUMMARY: The 2022 Summer Concert Series will feature six (6) band performances and the City's Annual Fourth of July Celebration event will feature two (2) band performances. The City Council will discuss and approve the six (6) band performances for the 2022 Summer Concert Series and two (2) band performances for the Fourth of July Celebration.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Staff recommends City Council discuss and approve the six (6) band performances for the 2022 Summer Concert Series and two (2) band performances for the Fourth of July Celebration.

FISCAL IMPACT: The 2022 Summer Concert Series includes one (1) concert approved in the Fiscal Year (FY) 21/22 budget and the remaining five (5) summer concerts and Fourth of July Celebration that will be proposed in the FY 22/23 budget. The estimated cost for all six (6) bands for the summer series is \$15,000 and the estimated cost for the two (2) bands for the 4th of July event is \$6,000. The total overall cost is \$21,000.

DISCUSSION: At the January 11, 2022 City Council Meeting, the City Council approved the City's Special Events Calendar including the Summer Concert Series and Fourth of July Celebration. The Summer Concert Series will feature six (6) band performances, each performing a two (2) hour set from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., occurring every other Thursday beginning June 9, 2022 to August 25, 2022. The Fourth of July Celebration will be held on Saturday, July 2, 2022 and will feature two (2) band performances, each performing a two (2) hour set from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. and 6:30 pm to 8:30 p.m.

In an effort to engage the community, staff has conducted a survey on the City's Facebook page and Parks and Recreation Instagram requesting their input on the band selections for the summer events. The findings have been summarized in a chart that can be referenced as Attachment A – 2022 Summer Concert Survey and

Recommendation from the Public, detailing the community input collected from the social media surveys.

Staff is seeking City Council's direction in selecting and approving the six (6) band performances for the 2022 Summer Concert Series and the two (2) band performances for the Fourth of July Celebration.

SUBJECT: CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE NO. 1257, AMENDING TITLE 1 "GENERAL PROVISIONS," CHAPTER 1.14 "ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY PROCEDURES," ADDING SECTION 1.14.085 "LATE PAYMENT CHARGES AND COLLECTION OF ADMINISTRATIVE FINES AND COSTS – SPECIAL ASSESSMENT PROCEDURES," TO SUPPLEMENT PROCEDURES FOR THE CITY'S COLLECTION OF ADMINISTRATIVE FINES AND COSTS

SUMMARY: The proposed ordinance would allow the city to seek recoupment of unpaid administrative fines and fees by establishing a procedure for recovery through a special tax assessment collected by the County in the same manner as ordinary municipal taxes are collected.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Staff recommends City Council waive first reading and introduce Ordinance No. 1257, adding section 1.14.085 allowing the City to recoup unpaid administrative citation fines and fees via special assessment collected by the County.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.

DISCUSSION: The City's Code Enforcement Division is tasked with enforcing the South El Monte Municipal Code (SEMMC) including the elimination of substandard housing, removing blighted conditions, promoting property maintenance, and ensuring compliance with all City municipal and zoning code requirements. When a violation has been investigated and identified by an officer of the Code Enforcement Division, a citation can be issued with an associated fine. The SEMMC has a set of protocols for the processing and appeal of these administrative citations.

If administrative fines remain unpaid, the SEMMC has a process whereby the City can file a lien on title against the property in violation. This process often results in a lengthy

amount of time before the City actually recoups the unpaid fines and fees.

At this time, City staff is recommending that the City adopt an alternative approach to fine recovery. This proposed process allows the City to impose a special assessment on the property for the unpaid fines and fees. The assessment can be collected by the County at the same time and in the same manner as ordinary municipal taxes are collected, and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in case of delinquency as provided for ordinary municipal taxes. All laws applicable to the levy, collection and enforcement of municipal taxes shall be applicable to the special assessment.

The proposed ordinance implements the procedure described above, consistent with state law and may result in the City recouping payment in a more expeditious manner than other fine recovery methods.

ORDINANCE NO. 1257

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SOUTH EL MONTE
AMENDING SOUTH EL MONTE MUNICIPAL CODE,
AMENDING TITLE 1 “GENERAL PROVISIONS,” CHAPTER
1.14 “ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY PROCEDURES,”
ADDING SECTION 1.14.085 “LATE PAYMENT CHARGES
AND COLLECTION OF ADMINISTRATIVE FINES AND
COSTS – SPECIAL ASSESSMENT PROCEDURES,” TO
SUPPLEMENT PROCEDURES FOR THE CITY’S
COLLECTION OF ADMINISTRATIVE FINES AND COSTS

WHEREAS, the City of South El Monte (“City”) has adopted codes to govern violations of City law and established, among other fines, administrative fines applicable to said violations; and

WHEREAS, Section 1.14.080, “Late payment charges and collection of administrative fines and costs—Lien procedure,” of the South El Monte Municipal Code (“SEMMC”) contains the regulations and procedures related to the recovery of unpaid administrative citation fines within the City; and

WHEREAS, unpaid administrative citation fines are increasingly becoming a problem within the City, and while the City currently has lien procedure in place, the City desires to adopt another option for fine recovery, in addition to the lien process allowed for at Section 1.14.080 of the SEMMC ; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 38773.5 allows a city, by ordinance, to establish a procedure for cost recovery through a special tax assessment. Government Code section 38773.5(c) provides that “[t]he assessment may be collected at the same time and in the same manner as ordinary municipal taxes are collected and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in case of delinquency as provided for ordinary municipal taxes.” Since the Government Code does not require council review, a hearing should be held to ensure due process for property holders. Said hearing can be held by a management member of city staff; and

WHEREAS, with the special assessment process, the City is more likely to recover payment as it is processed annually through the County tax assessor’s office; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to amend the South El Monte Municipal Code (“SEMMC”) as provided herein.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH EL MONTE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The recitals above are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2: Section 1.14.100 is to be added to Chapter 1.14 (Administrative Penalty Procedure) of Title 1 (General Provisions) of the South El Monte Municipal Code and is to read in its entirety as follows:

“1.14.085 - Late payment charges and collection of administrative fines and costs—Special Assessment Procedure.

A. Late Payment Charges. All late payment charges shall accrue in the same manner as provided in section 1.14.080(A) of this Code.

B. If the responsible party fails to satisfy in full the assessed fines, fees and costs by the time specified in the hearing officer’s decision or the administrative citation, and no timely appeal of the hearing officer’s decision has been filed with the Los Angeles Superior Court, the city may recover the outstanding fines and costs by imposing a special assessment lien against the real property on which the violation occurred.

C. In addition to other remedies listed in this code, the city may cause the fine or fines imposed by a payment order to be collected as a special assessment lien on the property on which any violation or non-compliance occurred by requesting the city council or independent hearing officer to hear and consider all statements, protests or objections raised about the amount of said fine or fines and fees on the Los Angeles County tax rolls for collection. The city council or independent hearing officer’s decision shall be in writing and issued within 10 business days of the hearing. The following procedures shall be utilized to impose assessment liens:

1. A Notice of proposed assessment lien shall be served on the owner of the property in the same manner as the administrative citation was served on the owner, or by mailing said notice by certified or registered mail, to the address shown on the official records of the county assessor. The notice shall state the amount of fine or fines sought to be imposed on the property as an assessment lien, the assessor's parcel number (APN) and/or legal description of the property on which the assessment lien is sought to be imposed and notice of the owner's right to appeal the proposed imposition of the assessment lien by filing a written appeal within ten days from the date of service or mailing of said notice. The notice shall warn the owner that a failure to file a written appeal with the city within said ten-day period shall constitute a waiver of the owner's right to appeal the imposition of the proposed assessment lien on the owner's property.

2. Within ten days from the date of service or mailing of said notice, the property owner may file a written appeal to the proposed assessment lien and pay any required fee to the city or waive the right to such an appeal. Whenever a property owner fails to file a timely appeal to a proposed special assessment, the department director shall prepare a document for recording with the County that imposes an assessment lien on the owner's property.

3. The city manager shall hear each appeal within fourteen calendar days after the date on which the appeal was filed. Written notice of the hearing date shall be served on the owner, at least, seven days prior to the hearing on the appeal. At the hearing on the appeal, the city manager shall consider the citation of the hearing officer imposing the fine or fines on the citee, the computation of the amount of the proposed assessment lien, the evidence that the owner owns the property on which the assessment lien is sought to be imposed and the evidence that the violation or non-compliance supporting the order of the hearing officer occurred at or was related to the property on which the assessment lien is sought to be imposed. At the conclusion of the hearing, the city manager shall determine whether or not to impose an assessment lien on the property of the owner in such amount that they deem to be fair and reasonable. The decision of the city manager shall be final and not subject to judicial review unless the citee filed a timely appeal pursuant to this code and applicable state law.

D. Notice of special assessment. When a special assessment is charged against property as provided in this chapter, the city shall mail a notice by certified mail to the property owner, if the property owner's identity can be determined from the county assessor's or county recorder's records. The notice shall be given at the time of imposing the assessment and shall specify that the property may be sold after three years by the tax collector for unpaid delinquent assessments. The tax collector's power of sale shall not be affected by the failure of the property owner to receive notice.

E. The city shall file with the county auditor a certified copy of the notice of special assessment, a brief description of the abatement action taken and a request that the charges be added to the tax rolls and collected at the same time and in the same manner as ordinary municipal taxes.

F. The remedies set forth in this section are not exclusive and may be used in addition to those set forth elsewhere in the Code or by law. The city may collect any past due fines and costs by use of any available legal means."

SECTION 3: The City Clerk shall attest and certify to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance.
